The children will begin by studying Branch One: Creation and Covenant. They will explore the life of Moses, with a focus on two significant events. The first event is 'God's Manifestation,' where Moses encounters God in the burning bush and learns God's name. The second event focuses on Moses receiving the Ten Commandments and reflecting on how these commandments shape our lives today. In the second half of the term, the children will move on to Branch Two: Prophecy and Promise. Here, they will study the life of David and examine the qualities of leadership through his example.	We will be learning about the 'Properties and Changes of Materials.' They will compare and group together everyday materials on the basis of their properties, including their hardness, solubility, transparency, conductivity and response to magnets.	We will be learning about the Alpine Region. We will develop our mapping skills, identifying where the Alps are, how they were formed, how avalanches and glaciers have changed the landscape and how homes are adapted to suit the climate.	We will be learning about how and why the Anglo Saxons came to England, what legacies the Anglo Saxons left us, and how England became a unified country.
