

Year 1 Curriculum Overview

English
Spelling – weekly spelling tests focussing on that week's phonics learning, plus common exception words
Grammar and Punctuation – Pupils will continue to focus on the correct use of capital letters, full stops and spaces between words. They will rehearse sentences orally to ensure they make sense.
Writing – Pupils will learn how to use adjectives to write setting descriptions. They will also learn to write short stories, instructions and short poems. We will continue to use the 'Reading Dogs' to support the pupils' comprehension skills.

<p>This half term our topic is 'Galilee to Jerusalem'. Pupils will learn about the different ways that meeting Jesus impacted upon people. The children will learn stories from the Gospel of Luke. We will discuss Jesus' mission and how we can carry this on within our own lives.</p> <p>Next half term our topic will be 'Desert to garden'. We will be discussing Jesus time in the desert. We will start to recognise the importance of giving to others and we will begin to sequence the events of the last week that Jesus was alive.</p>	<p>This term, the children will be learning about 'Animals including humans'. They will learn to group and sort animals into the five groups of vertebrate; reptiles, amphibians, mammals, birds and fish. They will also learn the names of animals in these groups and look at what they eat.</p>	<p>Our topic this half term is "The United Kingdom". Children will be taught the names of the countries in the UK along with their capital cities and the seas around the UK. They will also learn about physical and human features.</p>	<p>In the second half term, our topic will be 'What was life like for our grandparents?' We will look at what household items such as irons and televisions would have looked like and similarities and differences between then and now.</p>	<p>This term, pupil will learn about coding using Purple Mash. Pupils will learn how to create and run a simple program. They will also learn how to create and debug an algorithm using 2Go.</p>

<p>This term we will be exploring rhythm and beat further on unpitched percussion and the glockenspiels using the rhythm café rhythms. We will also be learning the song 'Round and Round' and using this to sing as a whole class and in smaller groups.</p>	<p>Pupils will begin the term by learning to explore gymnastic movements and balances on the floor and apparatus. In the second half term, children will learn how to control and co-ordinate their bodies to perform a sequence of movements, including a balance (freeze position).</p>	<p>RSE – The children will discuss special people in their lives and how to treat others with respect. Next half term, the children will discuss good and bad secrets, physical contact, harmful substances and will discuss who they should talk to if needed.</p>	<p>Next half term our DT topic will be 'The Pirate's Lunchbox', They will explore existing products, draw simple designs, make a lunchbox with a handle. The children will then evaluate their product.</p>	<p>This half term the pupils will be learning about printing. They will use their hands to print using paints and explore a range of mediums such as chalks, felt pen and different pencils to create marks.</p>	<p>World Book Day workshops 'Wild West' drama workshop Odds Farm Park trip</p>

Maths
Place Value and Addition and Subtraction The children will continue to develop number skills, focussing on place value and addition and subtraction. They will learn to partition numbers into tens and ones and write calculations such as $10+8=18$, $18-8=10$. Children will also learn about measures; length and height, and mass and volume. They will use non-standard units to measure these.
