<p><b>Spelling</b> – weekly spelling tests</p> <p><b>Reading</b> – Children will continue to develop their responses to retrieval and inference questions and develop their answers using PEE – Point, Evidence and Explanation.</p> <p><b>Grammar and Punctuation</b> – Pupils will continue to develop their use of grammar including effectively using pronouns and relative pronouns and understanding the different types of verb tenses and how to apply them in writing.</p> <p><b>Writing</b> – The children will be developing their literacy skills in differing strands of work. They will be studying 'Speech writing', 'Biographies', Persuasive Writing.' The poetry topic at the end of the term will be using and projecting their voice.</p> <p><b>Chosen Texts</b> – Wonder Lane by R. J. Palacio. This will be used as stimulus for both writing and reading tasks.</p>						<p>The children take part in daily Numeracy lessons.</p> <p>They have a range of arithmetic tasks to help them to warm up their maths brains.</p> <p>Subject areas include: <b>shape and space, statistics, measurement and mixed numbers, fractions, decimals and percentages, area and perimeter, algebra, ratio and problem solving.</b></p>
