Updates to our Anti-Racist Procedures

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are writing to inform you of changes to how we address and respond to racist incidents at St George's.

What has changed?

We have updated our procedures for recording and responding to racist incidents to ensure we:

- Continue to take all racist incidents seriously and respond appropriately.
- Keep clear records to help us identify patterns and prevent future incidents.
- Work proactively to create an anti-racist school environment where all children feel valued and safe.

What is a racist incident?

A racist incident is any incident which is perceived to be racist by the victim or any other person. We take all such incidents seriously, whether they involve pupils, parents, or staff.

How we will respond:

Our updated procedures include -

- A revised format of the letters informing parents that their child has been involved in a racist incident and what sanctions are in place.
- Working with children in school to educate and prevent future incidents.
- Any repeated incidences of racist behaviour will result in an internal exclusion.

We are committed to:

- Eliminating discrimination and promoting racial equality across our school community.
- Ensuring every child sees themselves reflected positively in what we teach.
- Creating a school community where diversity is celebrated and racism is challenged.

Reporting concerns:

If your child experiences or witnesses a racist incident, please report it to the class teacher. We will take all reports seriously and respond appropriately.

Please see a child-friendly version of this update, attached to this newsletter, to support you to discuss at home with your child.

Thank you for your continued support in creating a welcoming, inclusive school for all our children.

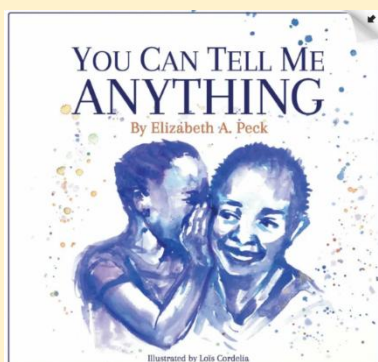

From 1 January 2026 MMRV will be offered as part of the routine immunisation schedule to protect children from:

- ✓ **measles**
- ✓ **mumps**
- ✓ **rubella**
- ✓ **chickenpox (varicella)**



✓ **Read the leaflet here**



If your child was born on or after 1 January 2025 your child needs to have their MMRV at:

- ✓ **first dose 12 months**
- ✓ **second dose at 18 months of age**

to have the best protection from all four diseases. Speak to your GP practice and have your Red Book ready.
