ILLEGAL PARKING

We have had a complaint regarding parking around The Clementine Churchill Hospital entrance. This has been a problem in the past and we have worked with the hospital in order to eradicate it. However, it would seem that some parents are not being considerate again, and it is the school who receives the complaints as we constantly strive to sustain cordial relationships with our neighbours as a Catholic school in the local community.

The complaint received described: cars parked on double yellow lines, cars parked almost across the entrance to Clementine Churchill hospital. This is used for people entering the hospital either to visit sick ones or are sick themselves getting help and St George's parents are blocking the entrance way.
