If your child is feeling unwell and isn't attending school please call the school office 02084221272 and select option 1. This should be done for each morning of your child's absence. Please state clearly your child's name, the child's class and the reason for the absence.

We now cannot accept "feeling unwell/ is sick" as a response, this will be marked as unauthorised if a full answer isn't recorded. We will send a PING if there isn't a reason recorded for your child's absence.

Signing Children in and out of School

If you arrive after 8:55am, please ensure that all pupils are brought to the School office and are accompanied by an adult when signing in.

Pupils must also be brought back directly to the school office and signed in by an adult when returning to school from appointments and ensure they are signed in the register.
